



# Christ Lutheran Church of Reese Michigan CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES Monday, October 27, 2025

**Opened in Prayer:** Pastor Phil opened in prayer at 7:02 pm

Kendyl asked if their home-schooling co-op could use about 7 classrooms and the Fellowship Hall for their classes once a week. The space they are currently using is no longer available. Their group does not have liability insurance. Council is concerned about liability issues, security issues for that many children on a regular basis, having all of our Sunday School Teachers put away everything that is in their classrooms currently, and the segmented flow of traffic throughout the church. Because of the issues that St. Elizabeth brought up with the training of volunteers and protecting children and our volunteers from sexual abuse allegations, we brought up needing background checks and possibly similar training to protect all involved. Council unanimously voted no. Jen Shores and several members said to check into the Methodist Church in Millington and the old church building over by Papios. Pastor closed the discussion in prayer and we wished Kendyl much luck, love and answered prayers for a building for her co-op.

#### 1. Monthly Reports

- a. **Secretary Minutes:** A motion was made by Mary Felske to accept the minutes with the amendments, supported by Robbie Oldenburg, and was carried to accept the minutes.
- b. **General Fund Report:** A motion was made by Irene Weiss to accept, supported by Robbie Oldenburg, and was carried to accept the report.
- c. **Special Funds Report:** A motion was made by Jen Shores to accept, supported by Irene Weiss, and was carried to accept the report.
- d. **Office/Pastor's Report:** He has made regular visits to the shut-ins, 1 funeral, says Adult Bible Study and 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> Grade Bible Study are going well. Pastor and Sandy would like to get two more cameras to cover all entrances. Mary Felske made a motion to purchase the cameras, Robbie Oldenburg supported and the motion was carried. Pastor wondered if we could put a QR Code in the bulletin, or on YouTube about the Electronic Payment Option. Pastor asked about doing a picture directory and Sandy will check into it. All Saints Day is coming up and the dinger is not working. He wondered if Diane Osantowski or someone could ring a handbell for each person who passed this year. Pastor will be out for vacation after the Christmas Day service and Pastor Mark will do the service on December 28<sup>th</sup>.

#### 2. Unfinished Business

- c. **2026 Repave the Parking Lot:** Sandy will be getting three quotes for repaving the parking lot.
- d. **GFI Plugs:** Carter DeLong said that he could map the plugs in the kitchen and put together a diagram to hang on the wall in the kitchen.
- e. **EMS**: Saginaw County would like area churches to sign up for the Emergency Management System Disaster Relief Network. Robbie made a motion to sign up, Jen Shores supported and the motion was carried.

#### 4. Ministry Reports
