

#### Christ Lutheran Church of Reese Michigan CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES Monday, April 21, 2025

**Present:** Chris Bublitz, Lora DeLong, Mary Felske, Shirley Grabowski, Trista Jeske-Yax, Sandy Schafsnitz, Jen Shores, Kelly Walz, Irene Weiss and Pastor Phil **Guest:** Deb Heinzman **Excused:** David Abraham and John Ward

#### **Opened in Prayer:** Pastor Phil open in prayer at 7:04 pm

- Deb Heinzman is struggling to find organists to fill in for Judy. Val Janson picked up Confirmation Sunday and Terese will play for funerals. Deb can order music videos that feature hymns that we typically use, from CCLI, to help fill in on the Sundays that we do not have an organist. Lora DeLong made a motion to order the music videos, it was supported by Irene Weiss and carried. Deb also suggested to have David Abraham cease streaming the music played before and after service, because we will have to pay additional licensing fees.
- 2. Monthly Reports
  - **a.** Secretary Minutes: Kelly will change the \$699 for the water heater to \$599 and change Mark Felske to Mary Felske in the March Meeting Minutes. A motion was made by Mary Felske to accept the minutes with the amendments, supported by Shirley Grabowski, and was carried to accept the minutes.
  - **b.** General Fund Report: A motion was made by Jen Shores to accept, supported by Shirley Grabowski, and was carried to accept the report.
  - **c.** Special Funds Report: A motion was made by Lora DeLong to accept, supported by Shirley Grabowski and was carried to accept the report.
  - d. Office/Pastor's Report: Pastor has made 4 home visits and 4 hospital visits.
- 3. Unfinished Business
  - **a.** Air Conditioning in the Fellowship Hall: Sandy Schafsnitz received three quotes for air conditioning the hall. Ryczek quoted \$56,000, Johnson Controls quoted \$25,000 and Goyette quoted \$23,000. Sandy was not impressed with Goyette. Jen asked if there were any riders to lock us into anything. Sandy did not believe so, but she will double-check with Johnson Controls and she will also check into the wording on electric and power install and clarify what it entails. This is tabled until we receive answers and will most likely require a vote from the congregation.
  - **b.** Gas Stove/Exhaust: This needed a new belt and has been fixed.
  - **c. Roof Drains:** We had standing water on the roof. Buchinger Roofing came out and cleaned the drains on the roof. We need to set up time in the spring and fall to clean out the roof drains, probably April 1<sup>st</sup> and November 1<sup>st</sup> should be put on the calendar. Sandy recommended having two people work together on this project.
  - **d.** Window in the Kitchen: The window in the kitchen has still not been fixed. We are asking people not to open the window until it is fixed. This is on John Ward's project list.
  - e. Boilers: Dean Boiler needs to fix three pump relay modules. The approximate cost is \$711.33 to fix.
  - f. AED Sign: Schwartz Graphics has created the sign, and Sandy will get it up this week.
- 4. New Business
  - a. Air Purifiers Filters
  - **b. Grass:** Tony and Carter DeLong will mow the grass this year. Deb Heinzman said that Ernie is willing to help as well.
  - c. VBS/Safety, Abuse and Neglect Training: St. Elizabeth is requiring all volunteer adults that are in their building to attend a two-hour training session in St. Louis, MI, Port Austin, MI or Freeland, MI. Kelly expressed the concern of trying to get all of the volunteers to the training before VBS starts and that some volunteers might not want to volunteer if they have to travel to and sit through all of the training. She is waiting to hear if there is on online option and/or if maybe just she and the three people that had the VBS program at St. Elizabeth could be the

only ones to do the training. Kelly also offered to have it at our church again this year. As soon as she has answers she will let everyone know. Jen Shores also may be able to find someone to provide this information to our volunteers as well, so that we do not have to travel.

#### 5. Ministry Reports

- **a. Ministry of Youth and Family:** Jen reported that the 6<sup>th</sup>- 12<sup>th</sup> Grade Youth attended The Chosen at the Vassar Movie Theatre. The Community Service project to clean up the church yard was done on April 12<sup>th</sup>. There is still more to do, so they will meet again on April 26<sup>th</sup>. The Younger Youth will be going to the Delta Pool on April 26<sup>th</sup>. The Community Garden will hopefully be planted on May 10<sup>th</sup>.
- b. Ministry of Property: N/A
- **c. Ministry of Worship and Music:** Irene asked Pastor Phil if we will be going to one service for the summer. It will be discussed at the next meeting.
- **d.** Social Ministry, Outreach, Congregational Life: Trista reported that they had 7 tables again and will probably do two events a month starting on the fall again. She will get with Kelly to work on a Loons Trip.
- e. Ministry of Education: May 18<sup>th</sup> will be the last Sunday for Sunday School, and they will have an Ice Cream Social for the kids and parents. Sunday School will resume Sunday, September 7<sup>th</sup>. May 18<sup>th</sup> is also Confirmation Sunday and Jace VanOchten will be our only confirmand.
- f. Ministry of Communication: N/A
- g. Pastor Phil is working through the shut-in list and trying to visit everyone. He would like to meet with families. He would like to begin with Church Council members after the shut-in visits. He also asked why we quit sharing the peace? We explained that it was because of Covid. He would like to begin sharing the peace again in a few weeks.
- 6. Lora made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Shirley supported, and the motion was carried. We closed the meeting with the Lord's Prayer at 8:27pm.
