

1. Monthly Reports

- a. **Secretary Minutes:** A motion was made by Jen Shores to accept the minutes with the correction from Tong DeLong to Tony DeLong, supported by Lora DeLong and was carried to accept the minutes.
- b. **General Fund Report:** A motion was made by Jen Shores to accept, supported by Lora DeLong, and was carried to accept the report.
- c. **Special Funds Report:** A motion was made by Jen Shores to accept, supported by Lora DeLong, and was carried to accept the report.
- d. **Office/Pastor's Report:** Pastor made 2 hospital visits, visited various shut-ins on rotations, Young Adult Bible Study ended last night, but will start up a 7th-12th Grade Youth Bible Study on September 14th. Pastor held the funeral for Richard Mossner on Wednesday. Pastor had questions on his Call Letter and Compensation Package and wondered if the Life Insurance amount could be switched to Long-term Disability, Sandy said that he can move it wherever he wanted. Also, with his auto allowance could it rollover to his lease? The paid vacation days do not rollover to the next year. Pastor wondered about a Sabbatical every 5 years for spiritual renewal, as long as he gave enough notice. Sandy said that she will look into it and Pastor will look into grants as well. 2. Unfinished Business
