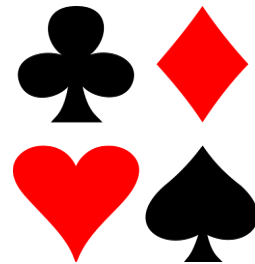

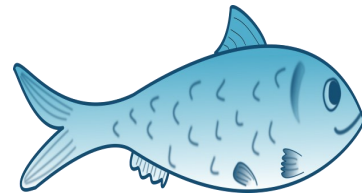

Session 4 – Protecting God - Jonah

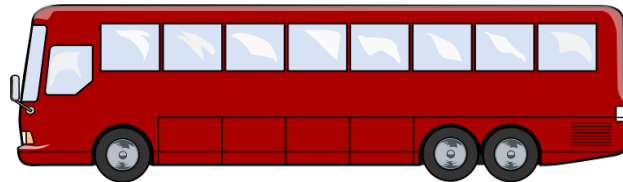

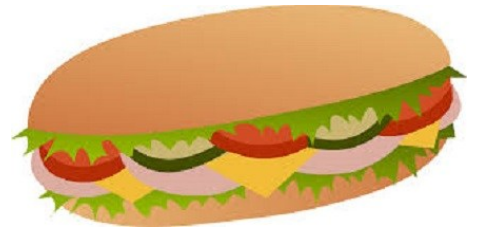

1. Monthly Reports

The last adult Sunday School class was Sunday, he plans to continue in the new year. The youth group Christmas party was last night. Confirmation is going well; Pastor is involving the parents before meeting with the kids.

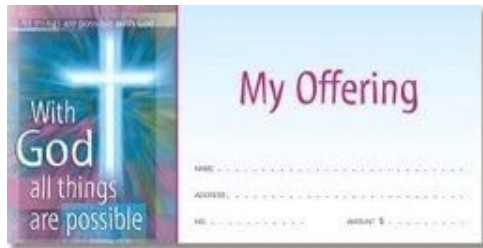
